
Pink Champagne Barrenwort





When blossoms appear in spring on this highly floriferous shade dweller, the mass of pink dainty spurs suggests a flock of miniature migratory birds in flight. Mature plants can produce up to 100 flower stems. NEW ITEM!





Epimedium 'Pink Champagne'

- <u>Use:</u> A dazzling unique Epimedium that will catch your eye-it certainly caught ours! Epimediums are uncommon in the market and in high demand. A great addition to the shady landscape that only gets better with time. Striking woodland groundcover or shaded border edging. Deer resistant!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: <u>Prefers part sun!</u> Prefer a cool (afternoon) shaded area that is moist but well drained. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Prefers to be kept moist and likes rich soil. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results.
- **Growth:** Grows 18-24" tall and 2-3' wide comes back every
- year. This is a very vigorous variety, but not weedy.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 4-8; Perennial. Mulch around plant in the winter. Make sure they have well drained soil in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Heart-shaped leaves are tinged with red in spring and fall. Its evergreen leaves are mottled green with dark burgundy.
- <u>Flower:</u> Produces flowers with white spurs and raspberry centers. Compared to 'Domino', 'Pink Champagne' has more dramatic pink tones. The delicate-looking flowers have an airy feel, making it the perfect contrast to other shade items like Hosta.
