Cestrum auranticum

- **Use:** These brightly flowered plants grow fast in warm, sheltered spots, with an arching, lax growth habit that benefits from consistent pinching and nipping back. May be cut back severely after flowering or fruiting. Clusters of tubular, inch-long flowers are attractive to hummingbirds; the showy fruit that follows can also attract birds. Add organic soil amendments before planting. Feed generously.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results.
- **Growth:** Super fast growing! To 8 feet tall and wide. Orange Cestrum can be grown as a container plant where not hardy but regular pruning may be required to keep this tropical shrub in bounds. It can also be trained as an espalier in areas where it doesn't freeze back.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8b-11; Annual, Houseplant, May be perennial in mild winters with protection.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Pinch back tips occasionally for a super bushy plant.
- **Flower:** Huge clusters of 1-1/2" tubular orange-yellow flowers are borne profusely throughout summer and fall on this vigorous shrub-like perennial and attract hummingbirds, bees, and other pollinators. The flowers are sweetly fragrant at night and likely attract hummingbird moths.
