

# Painted Echeveria



Use in rock gardens, mixed containers and desert plantings

## *Echeveria nodulosa*

- **Use:** A succulent with 1-2 foot long branched stems that lie over horizontally or arch slightly upward bearing 5 inch wide rosettes of absinthe-green, pointed leaves that are slightly concave above and keeled below and are vividly marked with red on the margins and mid leaf. In summer appear the pale yellow flowers marked with red on an up to 2 foot tall erect and unbranched inflorescence. The bracts have a coloring similar to the leaves.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to light shade in a well-drained soil and irrigate regularly to occasionally in spring and summer.
- **Growth:** Full, well branched plants grow 1-2' tall and 2-3' wide.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone 9-11**; Annual Very heat tolerant! Bring indoor in winter or into a garage. Hardy to 25 °F.
- **Foliage:** Unique succulent provides great contrast, with rosettes of absinthe green, vividly painted with red on margins and mid leaf.
- **Flower:** Yellow flowers bloom in summer atop tall bracts
