

Sonatini Mini Amaryllis



Yes, these are the ones that we normally grow indoors in a pot during the winter. If you live in zone 7 or warmer and your soil is well-drained (or can raise the flower bed enough for it to be well-drained) they will come back for many years.

***Amaryllis hippeastrum* 'Sonatini'**

- **Use:** We normally see these as tall, indoor-forced winter plants. However, when grown outdoors in the summer with more intense light and longer daylight hours, they bloom on much shorter stems in early-mid summer; we have planted them in our garden and have found them to be reliable, marvelous, eye-catching perennials.
- **Exposure/Soil:** **Start them indoors in a pot and plant outside after last frost (around April 20th).** Prefers full sun to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant when established, but prefers moist soil, but must be well-drained.
- **Growth:** The bulb will send out more stalks of flowers and grower larger over time.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10 Perennial Herbaceous.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long, strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** This is a mixture of colors so it will be a surprise as to the color you receive. Blooms midsummer. Excellent as a cut flower.
