

# False Freesia



## ***Freesia sp.***

- **Use:** This delightful, small, and easy-to-grow South African iris relative makes a small clump of 8" green, iris-like foliage, topped in May and June with small but brilliant scarlet-red flowers. For a small rock garden-sized plant, it puts on quite a show. The clump will go dormant in dry summers but returns in late winter. We have found it to be amazingly drought-tolerant, even in brutally hot climates
  - **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy.
  - **Growth:** Grows 10-15" tall.
  - **Hardiness:** Zone 7b to 10 (lift in fall in Zones 3-7) Perennial. Bulb.
  - **Foliage:** Deciduous. Strap shaped leaves.
  - **Flower:** Cheerful bright-orange-red flowers with darker markings.
