## Hyacinth Carnegie



- Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.



10 bulbs per bag (size=15/16cm)

## Hyacinth 'Carnegie'

- <u>Use:</u> An early bloomer with fragrant, white blooms emerging before the foliage on dense, arching stems. Narrow, soft sea green foliage remains dense to the base of the plant. Excellent naturalized hedge. Deer resitant. Super tough!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full— part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant once established
- *Growth*: Grows 8-12" tall.
- Hardiness: 4 -8 Bulb
- Foliage: Deciduous.
- *Flower:* Delicate, airy white flowers in early spring.
