

Carnegie Hyacinth



- **Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

Hyacinthus 'Carnegie'

- **Use:** Hyacinth Carnegie is the best white hyacinth for spring color. It blooms in mid spring and lasts long even under heavy rain. The bright, pure white blossoms are ideal for creating colorful flower beds. It goes well with large pansies and mixed with tulips. Deer resistant. Grow them in or outdoors for their graceful shape, long-lasting blooms and sweet scent. Hyacinths are great for indoor forcing, containers, and borders.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant once established
- **Growth:** Grows 8-12” tall.
- **Hardiness:** 4 –8 Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous.
- **Flower:** Delicate, airy white flowers in early spring.
