

Spring Star Flower

- **Use:** Makes cheerful carpets of sweetly fragrant, 1in star-shaped flowers beginning in early March. Plants grow just 3–5in tall, so they're ideal for edging a spring border or naturalizing under deciduous trees and shrubs, where they soon spread to form impressive colonies. A superb companion for early yellow Daffodils. Use in beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of sun) . Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Tolerates summer drought, but should be kept moist during growing season.
 - **Growth:** Grows 3-5” tall.
 - **Hardiness:** Perennial
 - **Foliage:** Deciduous. The grasslike leaves may appear again in fall, similar to Muscari, but don't be alarmed.
 - **Flower:** Fragrant, bright, deep blue overlapping perianth segments.
- **Planting density:** 2-3 inch apart, 12+ per sq. ft.
 - **Planting depth:** 4-5 inches to base of the bulb.
 - **Best planted in a mass for dramatic effect.**
