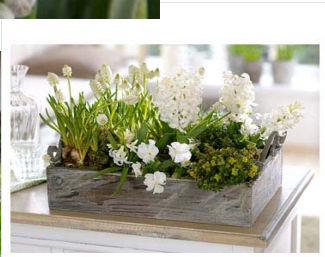


Siberian Tiger Grape Hyacinth



- **Planting density:** 2-3 inch apart, 10 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 4 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 60 or more for dramatic effect.**

Muscari armeniacum 'Siberian Tiger'

- **Use:** Bring spring indoors: This newcomer is said to be the one white Grape Hyacinth that you can force well in pots. Its tightly packed spikes of tiny globular flowers with greenish yellow buds are garden decorations, too. Let them mingle charmingly along paths or in beds with Violas or other spring bulbs.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep them cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 6-8" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Thin green leaves go dormant in summer heat.
- **Flower:** We love the sweet fragrance! Precious white - will lighten every garden and will be a great addition to the Moonlight Garden.
