Narcissus 'Golden Echo'

- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 4-5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 4 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** Narcissus blooms are for many gardeners the first visible signs of spring. These vigorous, long-lived bulbs thrive joyously in sunny, well-drained places, are shunned by hungry deer and voles, and will thrive and multiply with little care on your part, creating a glorious landscape and a horticultural legacy.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established. As with all Pink Narcissi, it benefits from filtered sunlight so that it may develop its best pink coloration.
- **Growth:** Grows to a height of 12-16" tall
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8. Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Sturdy stems. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering. They will die back by summer end. It grows above its slender foliage, has a faint fragrance and is also good for warmer climates.
- **Flower:** A vigorous Jonquilla Daffodil of beauty and contrast, bearing several fragrant blooms on each stem. The long, bright, and buttery cups even spill a bit of their color onto the creamy white petals. Hybridized in Virginia by Brent and Becky Heath. Midseason.
