

Tripartite Daffodils



Narcissus 'Tripartite'

- **Planting density:** 6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 30 or more for dramatic effect.**
- **Use:** You won't believe how long lasting these incredible daffodils are! Not only that, they are also intoxicatingly fragrant. Plant near a walkway or entryway to greet passersby. They are great for naturalizing, so you'll enjoy these beauties year after year. Heat tolerant, long-lasting flowers are excellent for cutting. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland garden. We find it to truly be the easiest bulb to plant in the garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-18" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial. Bulb.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Do not cut off the leaves after flowering.
- **Flower:** The first multiflowered split corona jonquil, so that the widely flared yellow corona looks like a six-petaled yellow flower nestling inside a large yellow flower. It also has a lovely sweet fragrance.
