

# Flaming Parrot Tulip



## *Tulipa 'Flaming Parrot'*

- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

- **Use:** The Flaming Parrot tulip is big, beautiful and bold. This parrot tulip is unique with a variegated yellow and red pattern gracing its ruffled, textured petals. Plant these beauties in large clusters for a showy display in late spring.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-20" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap like leaves.
- **Flower:** Have petals that are waved, twisted, curled or feathered. The flowers are very large and have bright colors. Almost twice the size of most Parrot Tulips, this riotous award winner is bright buttercup-yellow, with brilliant red flames with a yellow base, maturing to ivory-white with red flames. It is said to be the most widely used Tulip for cut-flower arrangements.
