

# Margarita Tulip



- **Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

## *Tulipa 'Margarita'*

- **Use:** Warm magenta tones with rosy highlights of Tulip Margarita shimmer in the sunlight. Packed with petals, the double early blooms open to reveal flowers that resemble Peonies. Strong stems are perfect for flower arranging although it may be a tough choice to remove these beauties from your garden for display indoors. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 30 to 60.

**Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.

- **Growth:** Grows 14-16" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap
- **Flower:** This dramatic early bloomer is vibrant magenta-purple with a magenta-pink sheen, a subtle scent, incredible stature and wondrously full flowers. Tulip Class: Double Early.
