

# Mount Tacoma Tulip



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb. **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

## *Tulipa 'Mount Tacoma' (Double Late type)*

- **Use:** The creamy-white blossoms of this classic have remained a favorite through the years. A robust double late variety, Mount Tacoma has won numerous awards since its introduction in 1924. Lush, large double blossoms. Heirloom. Double Late Tulips have extremely large blooms that resemble peonies. Their blossoms can be up to 4" across when fully opened. Ideal choice for rock gardens, beds, borders, and indoor forcing.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 14-16" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap-like leaves.
- **Flower:** The buds are pink and green, but the long-lasting flowers open creamy white. A great complement to the pink of 'Angelique' or almost anything else in your garden.
