

Orange Emperor Tulip



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

Tulipa 'Orange Emperor'

- **Use:** Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. The large flowers of this variety look incredibly elegant sitting on top of their tall stems. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50. Single late type.

Exposure/Soil: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall. Fertilize 2x a year with bone meal.

- **Growth:** Grows 18-20" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap like leaves.
- **Flower:** Who can resist the huge Emperor bloom in luscious orange. Fosteriana.
