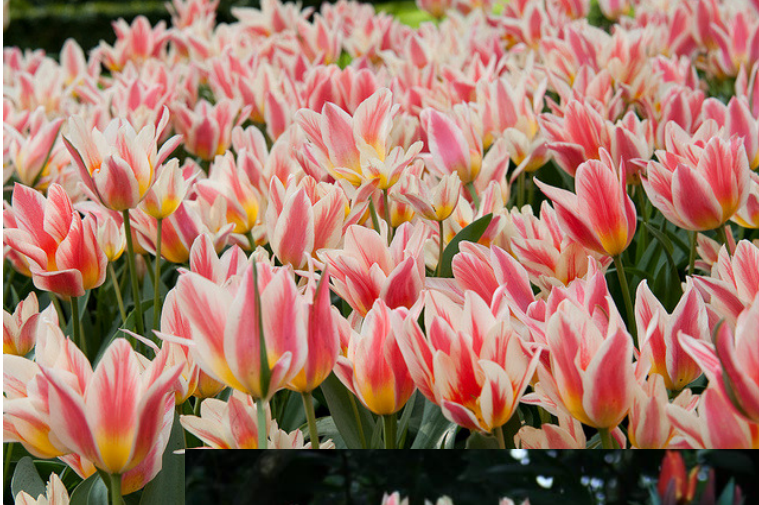


# Quebec Tulip



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

## *Tulipa 'Quebec' (Greigii type)*

- **Use:** Greigii Tulips, commonly referred to as Rock garden tulips, are recognizable by their purple and green variegated leaves. Tulips are hardy bulbs and can survive the most severe winters. Plant tulips in well-drained soil to ensure proper root formation. Exposure to full sun will bring out the rich colors that tulips offer, but some shade will enable a longer blooming period and still offer a colorful addition to your yard or garden. This tulip can create a very striking appearance in a garden, especially when grouped with other brightly-colored tulips. No spring garden should be without this beauty. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 30 to 60.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 14+” tall. Short type.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap like green leaves with dark grey freckles.
- **Flower:** Yellow with pinkish red stripes, shading to white near the edges. Early spring blooming. Multiple flowers per stem.
