

Red Ridinghood Tulip



- **Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

Tulipa 'Red Ridinghood' (Greigii type)

- **Use:** The perfect size for pots, for bedding with blue or white Grape Hyacinths (*Muscari armeniacum*), and for rock gardens. Early midseason. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50. Great for the patriotic garden with blue and white Muscari and Anemones

Exposure/Soil: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.

- **Growth:** Grows 10-12" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Purple-striped leaves extend the show, adding interest before and after bloom.
- **Flower:** A true beauty, with flowers that are scarlet red inside, carmine outside, and black at the base. Mid-late season
