

Tulip Salmon Impression



- **Planting density:** 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- **Planting depth:** 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

Tulip 'Salmon Impression' Darwin Type

- **Use:** Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50.
Exposure/Soil: Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 20-22" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap
- **Flower:** Lovely salmon rose with light edges. Just when everyone thought the Darwin Hybrids were already the largest-flowered tulips of all, the Dutch came up with even larger blooms with Pink Impression. It was introduced with great fanfare in 1979, and there have been some others added to the "Impression Group" since. But this is the one known worldwide for incredibly large, plump blooms that are a knock-out in the garden each spring.
