

# Tulip Sunlover



- **Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.**
- **Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.**
- **Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.**

## *Tulipa 'Sunlover'*

- **Use:** Sports rich, sumptuous oranges flecked with tangerine for color that shouts out across the landscape. Double petaled, almost like a peony, these tulips are elegant garden stars. Blooming in late spring, the flowers are spectacular, lushly petaled and long lasting. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. With its good looks and carefree nature, it's a longtime favorite in gardens across the country. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 25 to 50.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-18" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap leaves have stripes.
- **Flower:** Brings rich orange fireball flowers to the doubles. Large, fully double peony-like flowers.
