

# Toronto Tulip



- Planting density: 4-6 inch apart, 5 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.



## *Tulipa 'Toronto' (Greiggi type)*

- **Use:** The shorter stems of Dwarf Tulips, opens up a whole new range of uses- from rock gardens, to border frontages.... the uses are endless. Beds, rock gardens, in patio planters, and woodland gardens. For a show-stopping attraction in your garden, plant tulips in a group of 30 to 60.

**Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.

- **Growth:** Grows 5-12" tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8 Perennial Bulb
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long strap-like with handsome mottling on the leaves.
- **Flower:** Jasper red tinged on vermillion petals with 2-5 tulips on the same stem.
