Turkish Species Tulip



- Planting density: 2-3 inch apart, 10 per sq. ft.
- Planting depth: 6-8 inches to base of the bulb.
- Best planted in a mass of 20 or more for dramatic effect.

Tulipa turkistanica

- <u>Use:</u> Species Tulips are diminutive beauties ideal for niches in terraces, beneath deciduous trees and shrubs, and in rock gardens. <u>They are also more perennial than other types of tulips in</u> <u>our hot Georgia gardens.</u> With good drainage and lots of sun, they are especially long-lived.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Full-part sun (does best with some afternoon shade). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Place a layer of mulch over the bulbs in summer to keep cool and remove again in the fall.
- **Growth:** Grows 6-8" tall.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3-8 Perennial, Bulb
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Long strap-like, green leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> This fragrant early bloomer produces several flowers per stem yet still has a delicate wildflower look. The interior is white with an orange-yellow center, and the exterior is brushed gray-violet. Heirloom, 1875. Very early.
