- ***Lycopersicum Beefmaster Hybrid*** Intermediate type
- **Use:** One of the largest beefsteak types. The meaty tomatoes are big enough to overlap burgers and sandwiches. Nearly seedless and they have the fine beefsteak flavor. They shine as a slicer and the good-flavored fruit is tolerant of cracking and peeling. A mouth-watering giant red tomato, routinely wins the size award at county fairs and contests. A bigger-than-life variety you will admire and enjoy, this plant is resistant to Verticillium Wilt, Fusarium Wilt, and Root Knot Nematodes.
- **Exposure/Soil:** FULL SUN! Soak to depth of 6 to 10 inches when watering. They need at least 6 hours of direct sunlight a day. Tomatoes hate red clay so use a good soil such as our PRO_MIX. 80 days.
- **Growth:** Grows 36" tall and 36" wide. Plant tomatoes 2"-3" deeper than current soil line for a sturdy plant.
- **Hardiness:** 9-11, annual, houseplant.
- **Foliage:** Small, lacy leaves.
- **Fruit:** How big IS Beefmaster Hybrid? Well, plan on many 1-pound tomatoes, and some as large as 1 1/2 pounds! Despite all their bulk, they are also savory and delicious, with a good solids-to-gel ratio and intense flavor.
