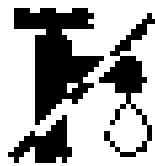


Variegated Thyme



Thymus x citriodorus



- **Use:** A hybrid thyme (*T. vulgaris* x *T. pulegioides*) that is primarily grown as a culinary herb for its rich, lemon-scented leaves. ' A favorite of all thymes, lemon thyme is great in the garden and the kitchen. Use in any recipe that calls for lemon, including marinades. The glossy green & white foliage is easily sheared into a tiny hedge if you are looking to create a traditional knot garden. Looks great in a pot. Often used in between stepping stones. **Deer resistant. Said to repel Mosquitoes.**
- **Exposure/Soil:** Tolerates full sun to part shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry to start. Little water needed once established.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower 2-4" tall x 10" wide and continues to spread by underground shoots. Lemon thyme grows vigorously, so you can trim back to keep neat and compact and enjoy the trimmings!
- **Hardiness: Zone** 4-9, Perennial; Evergreen in zones 8 and 9.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Variegated silver and green leaves.
- **Flower:** Tiny lilac flowers appear in summer.



Edible thyme good for use in cooking and great along walkways or between stepping stones. Said to repel mosquitoes.
