Vaccinium ashei 'Titan

- **Use:** The Titan blueberry has berries that are 2 to 4 times the size of an average berry and have been seen up to the size of a quarter! These super sweet, jumbo size blueberries were developed by the University of Georgia and were released for both commercial and home growing use in 2010. The Titan™ Plants are strong growers, and have a dry scar when picked, making this a good variety for freezing.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers light, acid soils (pH 4.5-5.2) with high organic matter (20-50%) are preferred, unlike most fruit crops.
- **Growth:** Moderate, 4-10' tall and wide; best if pruned.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; shrub
- **Pollination:** Plant more than one variety for cross-pollination to promote adequate fruit set. Also, choosing varieties from the different ripening categories provides a broad harvest season.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Bluish-green foliage.
- **Flower:** Berries are blue-black color; good fruit quality. Fruit mature in about 90 days from bloom. **More info from UGA on our website on the PLANT INFORMATION PAGE.**
