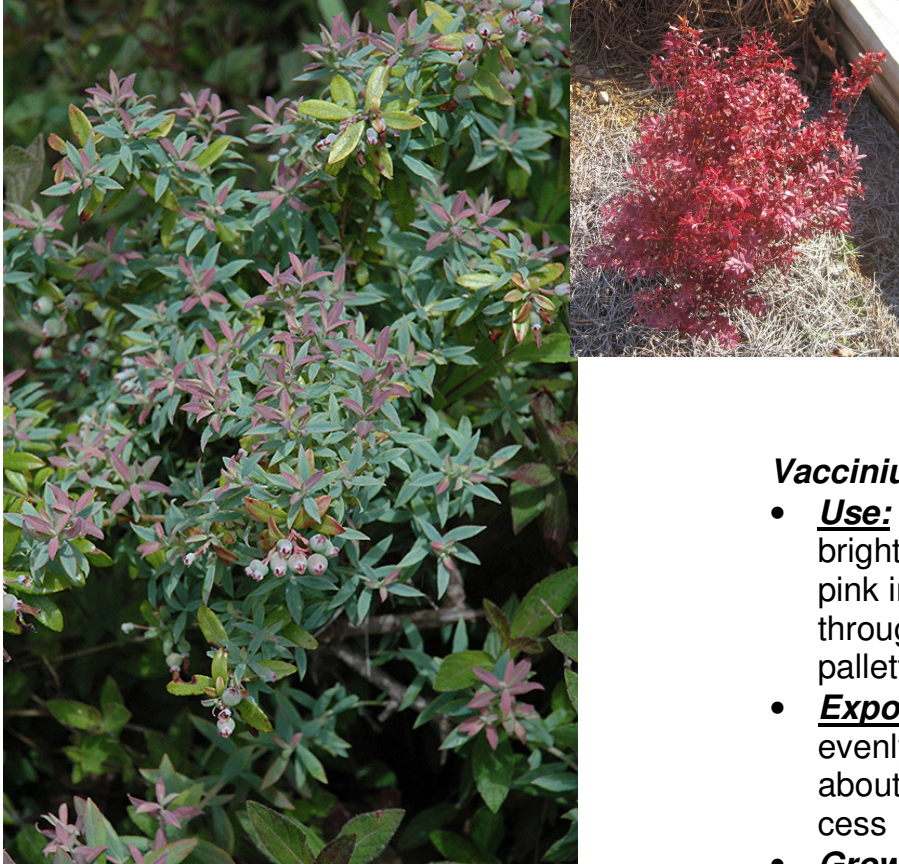


Rosa's Blush Blueberry Bush



This exciting, compact dwarf variety produces rose pink new foliage that matures to dusty blue-green in summer, then deep purple in winter; abundant crop of sweet blueberries in late spring; great for the garden or patio containers

- **Use:** Yes it fruits but it's fine textured evergreen foliage is fantastic! The bright pink new growth of spring matures to a dusty blue-green with hints of pink in summer, followed by deep purplish-blue in fall which deepens through winter. A tough dwarf native blueberry with as much to offer the palette of the mouth as well as the garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It is very fussy about its soil conditions and must have sandy, acidic soils to ensure success
- **Growth:** Grows 2 to 4 feet and 3 to 4 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9; Shrub
- **Pollination:** This type is self pollinating, but it helps to have other cultivars for heavier set.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. red-variegated bluish-green foliage which emerges rose in spring. The glossy oval leaves turn an outstanding plum purple in the fall.
- **Flower:** Clusters of 3/8" blue fruit that ripen in May-June, follow the light pink bell-shaped flowers of early spring. Excellent for muffins, pancakes, or fresh eating.
