

Carlos Muscadine

Vitis rotundifolia 'Carlos'

- **Use:** Bronze; Fruit are small to medium in size, ripen early to mid season, produce in clusters, ripens very evenly, is a very heavy producer, and has a dry stem scar. Carlos plants are very vigorous and cold hardy
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun. Muscadine grapes grow well on a wide range of soils but best results are obtained from well-drained sandy loams with a pH of 5.5 to 6.5. They will not tolerate low, wet ground.
- **Growth:** Plant in full sun at 15-20 ft. apart on strong trellises.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10; Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green above and green tinged yellow beneath, the leaves are glossy on both sides, becoming firm and subglabrous at maturity.
- **Flower:** The predominant bronze colored juice grape grown today. Smaller size fruits can also be fresh eaten. **[Print out more information from our Plant Info page on our website.](#)**
