

Doreen Muscadine



- Good for jelly, juice, or wine.
- Disease resistant.
- Ripens uniformly and late-season.
- 17% sugar

Vitis rotundifolia 'Doreen'

- **Use:** Doreen is grown successfully in the United States' Gulf and south-eastern states. Doreen's high natural sugar content makes it useful for sweet white wine, jelly and juice production. This *Vitis rotundifolia* (Muscadine) variety resulted from a Dixie x Higgins cross. This bronze-skinned grape generally ripens around mid-late season. Self-fertile 80 lbs. per vine.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun. Muscadine grapes grow well on a wide range of soils but best results are obtained from well-drained sandy loams with a pH of 5.5 to 6.5. They will not tolerate low, wet ground.
- **Growth:** Plant in full sun at 15-20 ft. apart on strong trellises.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-10; Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green above and green tinged yellow beneath, the leaves are glossy on both sides, becoming firm and subglabrous at maturity.
- **Flower:** Small sized fruit, but they make up for it in quantity. It is disease resistant (better than Carlos), and self-fertile muscadine grape vine (no cross pollination required). ***Print out more information from our Plant Info page on our website.***
