

Jumbo Muscadine



It is very vigorous, high yielding, with fair cold tolerance and very good disease resistance

Vitis rotundifolia 'Jumbo'

- **Use:** Jumbo is true to its name with the fruit largest of any muscadine cultivar so far introduced, Its skin is jet black and has an excellent Quality. Sugar content 16%. Ripens mid-season to late. The fruit ripens irregularly over several weeks, making it an excellent cultivar for home use. The vines are very productive, almost over-productive. Great disease resistant. As with all Muscanines this one is great for canning or eating fresh.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun. Muscadine grapes grow well on a wide range of soils but best results are obtained from well-drained sandy loams with a pH of 5.5 to 6.5. They will not tolerate low, wet ground.
- **Growth:** Plant in full sun at 15-20 ft. apart on strong trellises.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10; Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Leaves are oval to triangle-shaped, dark glossy green on top, lighter below and are toothed on the margins.
- **Flower:** The small flowers are produces in clusters of a few flowers in the spring, followed by a thick-skinned berry with musky-tasting pulp. Wild muscadine flowers are dioecious, male and female flowers on separate plants. Some cultivars are self-fertile, other require a pollinator.
