

Summit Muscadine



Summit turns a reddish-pink rose blush color when ripe and has extraordinary flavor. Medium to large fruit, very productive, excellent vigor, hardiness and disease resistance. Excellent cultivar for fresh eating, juice, or jelly.

Vitis rotundifolia 'Summit'

- **Use:** Summit muscadine grape is recommended by the University of Georgia to be the best main season bronze muscadine for the fresh fruit market.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun. Muscadine grapes grow well on a wide range of soils but best results are obtained from well-drained sandy loams with a pH of 5.5 to 6.5. They will not tolerate low, wet ground.
- **Growth:** Plant in full sun at 15-20 ft. apart on strong trellises.
- **Hardiness: Zone** 7-10; Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green above and green tinged yellow beneath, the leaves are glossy on both sides, becoming firm and subglabrous at maturity.
- **Flower/Fruit:** Red-bronze fruit is 1 inch in diameter. Excellent fresh eating grape. 20% sugar. Ripens early to mid September. Self-Fertile. Does not need pollinator.
