Crassula ovata 'Hobbit'

- **Use:** Compact succulent with deep green leaves that are curled back or spoon shaped. Often confused with 'Gollum' although this is an earlier Jade cultivar. It is a monstrose or mutated form of the common crassulaceae Jade. Trunk becomes thick with age and forms interesting stem shapes. Good for containers and bonsai cultivation. Drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to light shade in a well-drained soil and irrigate regularly to occasionally in spring and summer.
- **Growth:** Grows 1-3' tall and 1-2' wide
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11; Annual; Very heat tolerant! Bring indoor in winter into a sunny room. Hardy to 25 °F.
- **Foliage:** Branching succulent with fleshy tube-like leaves that mature from light green to bright red.
- **Flower:** Clusters of lightly fragrant white flowers rest on the leaves in the summer.
