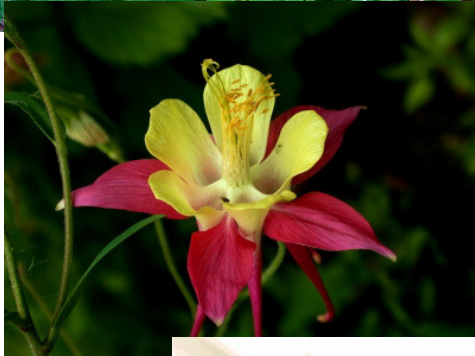


# Eastern Red Columbine

## ***Aquilegia canadensis***

- **Use:** This beautiful woodland wildflower has showy, drooping, bell-like flowers equipped with distinctly backward-pointing tubes, similar to the garden Columbines. An upright plant just right for the shady perennial border, patio, woodland plantings, or accents. Columbines are one of the easiest and most rewarding of all perennials. Their flowers are a treasure in spring and when they are through flowering their waxy green foliage continues to add grace to the garden. An eastern American native wildflower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun– shade. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer.
- **Growth:** Grows quickly 20-24” tall and wide
- **Hardiness:** 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Trifoliate, almost fern-like, basal green foliage with a bluish tinge.
- **Flower:** Delicate nodding flowers of red with extended yellow stamens with spurs pointing upward.
