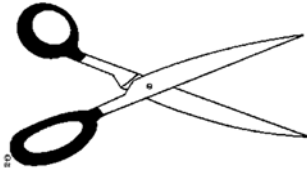


Goat's Beard



Aruncus aethusifolius 'Noble Spirits'

- **Use:** For a decorative, fern-like foliage and white flower spikes in late spring, start Aruncus seeds and enjoy this perennial for part sun. Similar to Astilbe, Aruncus is excellent for the shady landscape, and the foliage stays attractive all season long. Commonly, it is known as Dwarf Goat's Beard or Dwarf Korean Goatsbeard, and it's a great choice for a woodland garden or rock garden in part shade.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers afternoon shade. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Prefers to be kept moist and likes rich soil. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Drought tolerant once established. This is a good replacement for Astilbes in drier areas.
- **Growth:** Grows 1' tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone 4-8;** Perennial. Mulch around plant in the winter. Make sure they have well drained soil in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Deer resistant! Fabulous orange to red fall foliage color!
- **Flower:** Creamy white panicles float above the light green, deeply-cut foliage. This gives the feel if a lacy fern with the added bonus of a bloom.
