

Strawberries & Cream English Daisy



Often used to underplant tulips in large public landscapes, these are excellent anywhere in the garden, as well as in containers or tubs.



Bellis perenne 'Strawberries & Cream'

- **Use:** Completely covering the compact plants, they thrive in the partly shaded garden and in containers of all types. The plants reach just 5 to 8 inches tall and wide, with large, dark green foliage held below the bright blooms. A fine choice for baskets, windowboxes, and patio containers, this mix also works well in the garden, nestled among the spring bulbs and early bloomers. Here in the south, they are grown during the cool-season, where they will bloom through winter among the Snaps and Pansies. Yet, they will reseed and come back every year. English Daisies are not difficult to grow.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun(best) to part light shade. Prefers afternoon shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Prefers moist, humus rich soil.
- **Growth:** Quickly growing to 4-6" tall and 6-8" wide and continues to clump.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Neat little scalloped leaves.
- **Flower:** Features loads of cute little double button flowers, in a stunning blend of soft creamy-pink with a deeper rose-pink centre. Removing faded flowers regularly will keep plants blooming well into the summer.
