**Lovely deep blue flowers
and very easy to grow.**



***Campanula persicifolia* 'Blue'**

- **Use:** A traditional old cottage garden flower with stems covered in blue cup flowers. They mix in so well with the fox-glove, hollyhocks, and delphiniums. Pinch off old flower heads and these plants just keep blooming.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full-part sun, but protect from very hot afternoon sun if possible. Water when top 3" of soil is dry. Looks lovely outside on the patio in planter. Loves moist soil conditions.
- **Growth:** Grows to 1-3' tall, spreads to 1-1.5' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The foliage stays low and neat.
- **Flower:** Large, outward facing, broad bell-shaped flowers (to 1.5") in shades of white to blue bloom in open, slender, terminal racemes atop erect, unbranched, nearly leafless stems in late spring to early summer.
