Corydalis 'Porcelain Blue'

- <u>Use:</u> Astounding how truly aqua blue this corydalis is. Most blue colors in the garden have notes of lavender or sea green, but this one is actually, truly brilliant blue. You'll have lots of time to enjoy the color, this cultivar produces a first flush in spring, and then reblooms in late summer to fall. The foliage is slightly bluish too, also picking up notes of bronze. Corydalis is a shade-loving plant, so Porcelain Blue's extraordinary look can tantalize in the darker corners of the garden that rarely get so much attention. Grow three or five plants in a group to make the greatest effect in a larger garden.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part sun to shade. Well drained soils, and please amend red clay soils. Protect from afternoon heat.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; reaches 10 to 12 in. tall, 12 in. wide.
- *Hardiness*: 5-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Finely-cut blue-green foliage may take on a bronze cast in the heat but does not suffer from summer dormancy like others.
- **Flower:** Bears incredibly intense aqua-blue flowers over a very long period, usually blooming right into autumn.
