

# Mountain Frost Silver Strike Dianthus



## *Dianthus 'Mountain Frost Silver Strike'*

- **Use:** Dianthus start flowering at the end of February or the beginning of March, depending on your location, and if you remove the spent blooms, they will continue to rebloom right through to fall. They make excellent subjects for window boxes, baskets or planters. Valued rock garden plant, as edging or masses & in troughs & pots. Essential to cottage gardens.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Needs a sunny site with well-drained soil, but will tolerate some shade in the afternoon along with humidity. Regular watering during prolonged dry spells will be necessary. However, they are tolerant of short periods of dryness. Little water needed once established.
- **Growth:** The habit is compact and mounding to a height of about 6-8" tall and 10-12" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Displays tidy mounds of strong, silver foliage
- **Flower:** Bright, fragrant pink flowers with dark centers in Spring and continual blooming to Fall. Repeat blooms if sheared after first flush.
