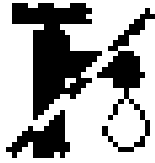


Glacier Blue Spurge



Euphorbia characias 'Glacier Blue'

- **Use:** This outstanding selection has evergreen leaves of grey-blue, strongly edged with creamy white, forming a midsized bushy mound. Conical flower heads appear in spring, made up of creamy bracts with a green eye. A plant for all seasons, particularly in mild winter regions.
- **CAUTION: skin and eye irritant/toxic if eaten.**
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun, but will tolerate light shade. In our area they must have well-drained sandy soil to thrive in our wet winters. They are very drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Grows 16-23" tall and 24" wide into a low mound. In June, prune entire spent flowering stems right back to near the base of the plant — new ones will form during the summer.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen; Ice blue leaves with creamy white margins and is impressive in all seasons.
- **Flower:** The flower bracts produced in spring echo the foliage coloration, giving additional seasonal interest.

It makes a graceful textural element in containers, borders, rockeries, and is also reasonably drought tolerant. It has good vigor and a stronger habit than other variegated Euphorbia.
