

Tasmanian Tiger Spurge



The mint green leaves and flower bracts of 'Tasmanian Tiger' are edged and striped with crisp white, adding extra visual appeal to its bold, architectural form. Its narrow, linear leaves densely encircle thick, upright stems, and remain evergreen to semi-evergreen throughout winter.

Euphorbia characias 'Tasmanian Tiger'

- **Use:** Airy, rounded flower clusters are displayed on the ends of the stems in spring. These are composed of showy, variegated bracts surrounding less conspicuous, small, pale yellow flowers. Tolerant of part shade but the best leaf color is produced in full sun. Use at the front of the border, in rock gardens, and in containers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun, but will tolerate light shade. In our area they must have well-drained, sandy soil to thrive in our wet winters. They are very drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Grows 36" tall and 36" wide into a low mound.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen; Narrow foliage with distinct variegation of green centers with white/cream margins.
- **Flower:** Topped with broad heads of flowers in summer, that are of the typical chartreuse color but with the bracts also plainly margined with white.
