

# Arborvitae Fern

***Selaginella braunii*** (syn: *Selaginella pallescens* or *incorrectly, Selaginella caulescens* and *Selaginella involvens*)

- **Use:** This selaginella (fern relative) is one of the easiest to grow in a woodland setting. The dark green, lacy, semi-evergreen fronds rise to 18" tall from a slowly creeping rhizome. In three years, you could expect a 2' wide mass. A grouping of these in a woodland setting is indeed spectacular!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Partial shade to shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. DO NOT LET DRY OUT!
- **Growth:** Slow growing to 6-12" tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-9 Perennial, Also a nice houseplant or in a terrarium. Must be mulched in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green, leathery frond-like, erect, branched leaves
- **Flower:** No flowers.
