Geranium 'Johnson's Blue'

- **Use:** The Royal Horticultural Society gave a prestigious Award of Garden Merit (AGM) to 'Johnson's Blue', and one can see why. It is a superb plant for cottage gardens, container growing, borders or informal borders in mass plantings.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Being drought tolerant, needs a full sun area with some shade in the afternoon. For best results, plant in a dry to moist area in a well-drained site.
- **Growth:** Plant width of 23-27" and a height of 18". Needs to be cut back in early summer for repeat bloom time in the fall.
- **Hardiness:** 3-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Dark green foliage is well known for its stunning fall colors that include reds, oranges, and yellows.
- **Flower:** Has rich sky-blue flowers that fade to pear gray as they mature, blooming from June till August.
