

# Tequila Sunrise Avenas



## *Geum 'Tequila Sunrise'*

- **Use:** This new hybrid forms a low clump of glossy, light green leaves, with taller, branching burgundy-purple stems. Flowers are medium-sized, single to semi-double, yellow with rose tips and appear late spring through to early summer. The flowers are good for the vase and for drying. Suitable for Containers. They are fully hardy and resistant to slugs, rabbit and other pests. Well drained soil. Will bring the bees and butterflies into the garden. Drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun preferred. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Remove faded flowers regularly to encourage more buds. Plants may be pruned back hard after blooming, to rejuvenate the foliage.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 3' tall and wide. Clumps should be divided every 3 to 4 years in spring or fall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9, Perennial. Reseeds
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Plants form a low clump of coarse green leaves, with branching stems held above bearing medium-sized rounded flowers.
- **Flower:** Cheerful single to semi-double yellow flowers brushed with red top off 18-24" dark red stems from May into June. Repeat blooming if pruned back.

Sunny blossoms bring cheer to the garden.
