## Daylily 'Purple d'Oro'



A very reliable rebloomer with its first flush in early summer then repeating on and off into fall.



## Hemerocallis 'Purple d'Oro'

- <u>Use:</u> If you love the 'Stella d'Oro' you'll flip for her purple cousin. You'll be thrilled with the first flush of 3" purple blooms in summer to early fall. Plant them both together for combo from opposite sides of the color wheel.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full— part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Do not give too much nitrogen or they will not produce flowers. Once established needs only occasional water.
- <u>Growth</u>: Growing only 20" tall, you will be able to find several places for it in your garden flower stalks are held well above the foliage on 24" scapes.
- *Hardiness:* Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous.
- <u>Flower</u>: Reddish-purple blooms have a yellow-orange throat and orange backs.
