

# Cajun Fire Heuchera



**An excellent addition to the shady garden or mixed container.**



## *Heuchera x 'Cajun Fire'*

- **Use:** A garden chameleon, emerging red in spring, changing to black in summer and maroon in fall. Delicate white flowers on short dark stems over rounded mounds. Attracts hummingbirds to the garden! Both flowers and leaves are popular with flower arrangers for cutting. Outstanding at close range for outdoor living areas and front entry foundation planting. Exceptional container plant for bold effects.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade, but more sun tolerant than other types. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Foliage reaches 102in. tall, 24 in. wide; blooms reach 20 to 24 in. tall.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Changing colors with the season: red in spring, black in summer, maroon in fall!
- **Flower:** Topped with 18" spikes of tiny white flowers in spring.
