

Heuchera Carnival Black Olive



Heuchera 'Carnival Black Olive'

- **Use:** Has *Heuchera villosa* parentage for excellent heat tolerance and better garden performance. These versatile perennials can be used in a shady courtyard pot or as a groundcover under deciduous trees
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part shade. More sun tolerant than other coral bells. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 10-12 “tall, 12-14” wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. is noted for it's purple to black foliage which is the charm of this newcomer.
- **Flower:** Dainty flowers are held aloft on airy stems May through July.

Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.
