

# Heuchera Carnival Cocomint



## *Heuchera 'Carnival Cocomint'*

- **Use:** Coral Bells are a versatile perennial. This villosa hybrid, part of the Carnival series, known for their tidy mounding habit and excellent heat and humidity tolerance, is a terrific choice for adding a touch of colour towards the front of a border. Produces tall, airy sprays of small white flowers. A great choice for adding texture to borders or mixed containers. Tolerates heat and humidity.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part shade. More sun tolerant than other coral bells. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; foliage reaches 10 to 12 in. tall, 12 to 14 in. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Tidy, low mounds of lightly textured, heavily lobed, rich mint green, silver-frosted foliage with burgundy venation.
- **Flower:** Dainty white flowers are held aloft on airy stems May through July.

**Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.**
