

Georgia Peach Premium Coral Bells



Heuchera 'Georgia Peach'

- **Use:** The absolute "must have" Heuchera of the season, 'Georgia Peach' astounds and delights with giant, rounded leaves of silvery-peach with deep rose tints and prominent veining. It's an understatement to say that this is an attention-getting plant; the only word that really describes it is "eye-popping"! These versatile perennials can be used in a shady courtyard pot or as a groundcover under deciduous trees
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part shade. More sun tolerant than other coral bells, but may get some leaf burn in August when temps go above 90. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 8 "tall, 16" in bloom overall, by 24" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Individual leaves can grow quite large -- 8 inches is not unheard of! It leafs out in mid-spring with pinkish-orange tones overlaid by a silvery sheen
- **Flower:** By early summer is topped with clusters of ivory blooms on 30-inch stems.

Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers.

Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.
