Heuchera 'Obsidian'

- **Use:** One of the great horticultural success stories of the last generation, Heucheras have metamorphosed from an obscure genus of North American wildflowers to garden stars available in a seemingly endless array of cultivars. 'Obsidian' is a perfect illustration of why these perennials are finding such popularity.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 14 "tall, 24" in bloom overall, by 12-18" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The glossy dark maroon, almost black, leaves keep their color all season, posing a startling contrast to the carillons of white flowers borne in June and July.
- **Flower:** *White* bell-shaped blooms rise above height given: up to 16" in the summer.
