

# Infinity Foamy Bells



## *Heucherella 'Infinity'*

- **Use:** Infinity has large, dark, chocolate colored, velvety leaves that work together to form a mounding, bushy perennial, making a statement in any garden. The deeply lobed, matte finished leaves look as if they've been covered in dark chocolate cocoa powder. Creamy pink buds open to cream colored flowers on two foot spikes that bloom continuously from the end of May to late September/early October.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part shade (afternoon shade preferred in South). Best when planted under trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 18-24" tall by 24-36" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Large deeply cut silvery chocolate foliage that looks like it's been dusted with cocoa powder.
- **Flower:** Masses of starry pale pink flowers are borne in a haze on long stems all from spring to autumn .
