

Redstone Falls Foamy Bells



Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.



Heucherella 'Redstone Falls'

- **Use:** The ruby-splashed, butterfly-like foliage is adorned in wonderful, warm autumnal tones. These change colors with the seasons adding to its interest. It's so nice spilling out of a container in sun or shade or use it in your mixed beds. Vigorous grower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 20 "tall, 28" in bloom overall, by 24" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Broadly lobed copper leaves with dark veining. Changes in fall to warm autumn colors displaying reds, oranges and golden tones interwoven throughout the foliage.
- **Flower:** Though small white flowers appear in late spring, this plant is really grown for its unique foliage color.
