

Kopper King Hibiscus



These glorious plants with impressive large flowers make showy accents. In fact, the Hibiscus produces the largest flowers of any perennial!

Hibiscus x x moscheutos 'Kopper King'

- **Use:** Distinctive copper-red, lobed, maple-like leaves provide a striking backdrop to the huge, hollyhock-like light pink flowers with red veining and a bright red eye. This vigorous selection has a compact, rounded form and blooms over a long season, making it a perfect addition to the shrub or perennial border.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Needs rich soils, consistent moisture and full sun. Also does well in clay soils. Good air circulation may help to prevent disease. Cut back stems to about 3-4" in Autumn.
- **Growth:** It has a plant height of 3-4' and a spread of 3-4'.
- **Hardiness:** 4-9 Perennial. Mulch during winter to protect roots from frost and prune in early spring for bushier growth.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Leaves that are a coppery red on top and orange-red underneath.
- **Flower:** Large (10 to 12 inches across) ruffly white to pale pink flowers bloom from midsummer to mid-fall if you deadhead.
